LOAN FROM GENERAL FUND TO WATER DISTRICT NO. 4 (COCKRAM ROAD) RESOLUTION #30:

Councilman Redick offered the following resolution and moved for its adoption:

WHEREAS, Water District No. 4 has exhausted its available funds and there remains a shortage of Two Thousand Nine Hundred Fifty-One and 73/100 Dollars (\$2,951.73) due to the fact that Rural Development has exhausted the Stimulus Funds which were to be used to increase the grant available to Water District No. 4;

NOW THEREFORE, it is hereby resolved that Water District No. 4 is hereby authorized to borrow from the Town of Byron General Fund the sum of Two Thousand Nine Hundred Fifty-One and

73/100 Dollars (\$2,951.73) at one and one half percent (1.5%) interest per annum and to repay the principal and interest over a period of five (5) years beginning in the year 2012, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that said General Fund is hereby authorized and directed to loan such money to Water District No. 4 on said terms and conditions

Highway Superintendent Heins: The \$32,000 was from the J.D. Northrup Construction money that was held back for Water District No. 1. (The money was transferred via resolution at the April 8, 2009 Town Board meeting)

Councilman Thompson: Went to houses on Swamp and Hessenthaler Roads that never returned their Income surveys for water, dropped off new ones, and explained the necessity of filling them out and returning them.
