NYS DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION DETOUR

RESOLUTION #43:

Councilwoman Freeman offered the following resolution and moved for its adoption:

WHEREAS, the New York State Department of Transportation proposes to rehabilitate two culverts carrying Route 237 over tributaries of the Black Creek (C.I.N. C410066 & C.I.N. 410073) in the Town of Byron, Genesee County under P.I.N. 4T38.10.

WHEREAS, in conformance with Section 10, Subdivision 19 and Section 42 of the New York State Highway Law, the New York State Department of Transportation proposes to utilize the following roads and streets as detours during the period of construction.

·Searls Road (C.R. 7 to Cook Road) and

Cook Road (Searls Road to Rte. 237)

WHEREAS, the New York State Department of Transportation will provide traffic control devices and make improvements or repairs when necessary to the above mentioned road to make them adequate to handle additional detour traffic.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Town Board of the Town of Byron does hereby authorize the New York State Department of Transportation to utilize the above mentioned roads and streets as detours and maintain traffic on them in accordance with the Subsection 619 of its Standard Specifications during the period of necessity.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Town of Byron will continue to provide routine maintenance on the above mentioned roads and streets, including snow and ice control.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Clerk of this Town is hereby directed to transmit four (4) certified copies of the resolution to New York State Department of Transportation.

•Continue to work with the Planning Board as a resource on the Zoning Ordinance update. •Working with residents on swimming pool compliance, so far this season five illegal pools have been removed and two have met the code requirements for a storable swimming pool.

•Special Use Permit application for home occupation (gift wrapping service) applicant Donna Durand at 6383 Townline Road. Public Hearing scheduled for August 19, 2011 at 7:00 p.m.

PARK COMMITTEE REPORT – Councilman Redick:

•Due to liability concerns, the Town will need to supply Chad Huhn with a legal document that relieves him of any liability if the Memorial Duck Race is to be conducted with participants or spectators on his property. Councilwoman Freeman suggested having Tompkins list Chad Huhn as co-insured.

•Wayne Austin is in the process of checking the Fire Departments by-laws to see if having one fire department representative is sufficient on the Park Committee's board.

•A 100 amp electrical service has been installed in Firemen's Pavilion. Is Town paying for electrical upgrades? Superintendent Heins suggested that the Dib Nightingale Account pay for it.

•The storage building suffered some vandalism with the glass blocks on the west end being smashed out. It's been decided to eliminate the glass blocks and replace with cement blocks. Wire and lighting has been installed since the glass blocks will be replaced eliminating natural light.

•The North end of the tennis court is in need of some attention because the bottom of the fence is not attached well to the piping. Al Secash will look into it and make repairs.

On Tuesday evening, July 26th, the Park Committee is having a work detail in the park to spruce it up prior to Heritage Days. Jobs include painting the garbage cans, swing sets, picnic tables, and basketball back boards.

•The Park Committee is considering having the wooden fence on the South end of the park near the pavilion stained. They will be looking into having individuals that have been sentenced to community service complete this task. According to the Town Clerk it has already been done by Eddie Sharp.

•Carrie Capostagno from Caswell Road submitted to a contest at Lowes, where she works, for a town upgrade project. Carrie's request was for upgrading the dock at Turtle Park, and she won. For winning the contest, Lowes will supply up to \$1,200 in material and labor to help complete the project. The Park Committee is in the process of seeing if the winnings solely have to go to that particular project, or if possible, could it be split up to make some repairs to the dock in Trestle Park. The Town Board asked the Supervisor to send both Carrie and Lowes a Thank You note.
