•Superintendent Heins left a message for Eric Wies and hasn't heard back from him regarding the highway garage.

•Eric Wies contacted Supervisor Felton and Eric's waiting to hear back from Morton before moving forward

LOADER BIDS: Three bids were opened on Tuesday, April 7th at 3:00 p.m. Five Star Equipment (John Deere): New 2009 Front End Loader \$132,476; Trade Allowance: \$50,000; Net Trade, Delivered: \$82,476; Annual Hourly

Trade Amount: \$10

George & Swede Sales & Service (Hyundai): New 2009 Front End Loader Hyundai HL757-7A Wheel Loader \$126,193; Trade Allowance: \$55,000; Net Trade, Delivered: \$71,193; Annual Hourly Trade Amount: \$10

•Superintendent Heins was concerned that the Hyundai had no bid specification sheets returned to explain exceptions or deviations. Some obvious literature deviations: Only one brake pedal – bid sheet specified two, 70 amp alternator – bid sheet specified 90 amp, two batteries – bid sheet specified four batteries, cannot decipher quick attach bid if even included. He would recommend an invalid bid for Hyundai.

•Supervisor Felton reviewed two scenarios – purchase of highway equipment with borrowed funds vs. purchasing equipment without borrowing funds for 2009-2020.

·Councilwoman Freeman, Councilman Ivision, Councilman Redick and Councilman Ferguson would all like to abide by the yearly replacement sheets with no borrowing of funds for highway purchases.

RESOLUTION #43:

Councilman Ferguson offered the following resolution and moved for its adoption:

Supervisor Felton and Councilman Ivison are hereby authorized in opening a deposit account, and that they are duly authorized to act on behalf of the Town of Byron, and that the Town of Byron is a State of New York local government entity, duly organized and validly existing under the laws of the State of New York; and, if applicable, that the resolutions set forth below or provided separately to HSBC Bank USA, National Association have been duly adopted by the Town Board, at a meeting duly called and held on April 8, 2009, that each of such resolutions is in full force and effect and none has been rescinded, revoked, or modified; and that none of such resolutions nor any action pursuant thereto will violate any law, rule, regulation, charter, by-law or agreement by which the Town of Byron is governed, constituted or bound. Resolved, that:

1. HSBC Bank USA, N.A., a New York Banking corporation, is hereby designated a depository for this entity (the "Depositor") and the offices or employees named above are hereby authorized to open one or more deposit accounts from time to time (each an "Account") on behalf of Depositor.

2. HSBC Bank USA, N.A. may purchase, give credit for, cash, accept, certify and pay from funds on deposit in the Account, without inquiry, all items signed, drawn, accepted or endorsed on behalf of Depositor, whether under a title, the words "Authorized Signature" or otherwise, with the purported actual or facsimile signature or anyone of the officials whose names, capacities and specimen, signatures appear above or on a Rider hereto, or his or her successor in office (each an "Authorized Signer"), regardless of the circumstances under which the signature shall have become affixed if it resembles any actual or facsimile signature previously certified to HSBC Bank USA, N.A. Depositor shall indemnify HSBC Bank USA, N.A. against all claims, damages, liabilities, cost and expenses (including, but not limited to, attorneys' fees and disbursements) incurred by HSBC Bank USA, N.A. in connection with honoring any purported signature of any Authorized Signer or any refusal to honor the signature of any person who is not an Authorized Signer. Depositor acknowledges that dual signature requirements and restrictions impose no duty of enforcement on HSBC Bank USA, N.A.

3. Any Authorized Signer may, on behalf of Depositor, transact with and through HSBC Bank USA, N.A. all such business as he or she deems advisable upon such terms as he or she deems proper, including but not limited to, obtaining an undertaking and pledge of collateral for uninsured balances in the account, entering into custodial agreements concerning such collateral, obtaining such loans and other extensions of credit as may be consistent with applicable law, discounting, selling, assigning, delivering and negotiated items, guaranteeing the obligations of others pursuant to applicable law applying for electronic funds transfer, capital markets products, automated clearing house ("ACH") payments, cash management, trust and investment products and any other services or transactions; and, in compliance with all applicable law and procedures, pledging, hypothecating, assigning, mortgaging, encumbering, granting in connection with any such transaction of business do all acts or other things as he or she deem proper including but not limited to, signing, accepting, executing and delivering items, guarantees, assignments, pledges, hypothecations, receipts, waivers, releases and other instruments, agreements and documents, making and receiving delivery of Property, accepting receiving, withdrawing and waiving demands and notices and incurring and paying liabilities, costs and expenses.

4. In the event an Authorized Signer acting on behalf of Depositor shall apply to or contract with HSBC Bank USA, N.A. for any electronic funds transfer service that HSBC Bank USA, N.A. may make available to Depositor, including, but not limited to, any service that contemplates HSBC Bank USA, N .A. execution of payment orders initiated by Depositor for the wire or ACH transfer of funds to or from an Account of Depositor, such Authorized Signer shall be empowered on behalf of Depositor to designate one or more persons (who may, but need not be, Authorized Signers), each of whom, acting alone, shall be authorized on behalf of Depositor to transmit payment orders to HSBC Bank USA, N.A. for the transfer of funds to or from Depositor's Account. 5. WHEREAS, the final payment to J.D. Northrup construction, Inc. for its' contract to construct the water mains and related facilities for Water District No. 1 was made pursuant to its' application for final payment in July of 2002, and such final payment was deemed proper by the engineer and attorney for Water District No. 1, and was made August 21, 2002, and

WHEREAS, no further application has been made, and

WHEREAS, more than six (6) years has passed since such final payment and the Statute of Limitations on claims pursuant to the contract has run, and

WHEREAS, Water District No. 1 reserved \$39,538.17 for possible claims by J.D. Northrup Construction, Inc. for restoration or other claims and claims by J.D. Northrup Construction, Inc. for restoration or other claims, and
