Notes:

Looking back through past records as far back as 1996, high flows have been recorded during wet weather events. The difference now being is it seems to be more prolonged. Lasting several more days then in the past. We are aware of the smoke testing and several repairs made to the system as a result of the report. VRI has reviewed the smoke testing report and in it the tester referred to a couple of roof drains that may be hooked into the sewer system, but we don't know of any follow up. Also there is no mention of sump pump inspections. Illegal sump pump hook ups can be a major source of infiltration. VRI suggests a sump pump inspection program be put in place to combat the high flow problem. All lab results were in compliance with the town SPEDES permits, but we have sent in a noncompliance report to the DEC for going over the flow limits.

Councilwoman Freeman: She would like to know if the homeowner who had the problem paid for VRI to come out? If the problem was created by the homeowner, according to the Sewer Ordinance they are liable for payment.

Supervisor Felton: He will check into it.

Byron Town Park Committee – 2008 Report

The Byron Town Park Committee includes: George Hillabush (Chair), Donna Bobzin (Treasurer), Rev. The Park Committee members are appointed by the Byron Town Board, and normally serve 3 year terms. The liaison from the Town Board is Supervisor Tom Felton.

The committee normally meets on the first Wednesday of the month, 7:00 PM, at the Byron Fire Department. Visitors are always welcome, and we especially welcome hearing ideas from residents concerning the use and improvement of our parks. The park areas the committee is concerned with are: **Trestle Park** (can be reached by car from Byron-Batavia Road or on foot from Terry Street), **Firemen's Park** (behind the Byron Fire Hall), and **Turtle Park** (on Swamp Road).

FINANCIAL REPORT:

OTHER BUSINESS:

Fire Contracts: Received a reworded contract from Byron Fire Department. Supervisor Felton is consulting with Jason Molino, from the City of Batavia, the Town attorney, and our insurance agent regarding changes that have been made. Supervisor Felton has also consulted with and submitted changes to the fire departments and is now awaiting their response and endorsement.

WATER DISTRICTS:

Water District No. 2 – is pretty much closed out Water District Nos. 3 & 4 – should hear from Comptroller within next two

weeks

Water District No. 5 – the Town solicited input from residents and received responses from approximately 75% of the residents. Still need to hear back from some property owners before 51% approval is reached and the district can move forward.

COCKRAM ROAD (West of Rte. 237):

The Town Board received a petition for water for 5 homes on Cockram Road, west of Rte. 237. The Town Board accepted the petition, but Supervisor Felton does not believe a water district in this area would be feasible because of the amount of green space, and it would probably be dead ended. However, Supervisor Felton will follow up with Eric Wies from Clark Patterson on the petition.

AUDITS AND INSURANCE:

Councilwoman Freeman and Councilman Ferguson will be reviewing the Town Clerk's, Bookkeeper's and Justice's books on February 9th.

Councilwoman Freeman will be sending out letters to the Sewer and Water Committee to set up a meeting

Insurance and deductibles – Bookkeeper is covered up to \$60,000. There are checks and balances and that's why the bookkeeper coverage is so low. Mr. Sackett asked about higher deductibles at a prior meeting – the Town has a \$1,000 deductible now and with a \$2,500 it would save the Town \$142.85, with a \$5,000 deductible it would save the Town \$277.77, and with a \$10,000 deductible it would save the Town \$462.90 per year. All council members believe the higher deductibles and lower premiums represent too much risk for too little reward.

EBBONY MEETING:

Supervisor Felton: Met with the Towns of Elba and Bergen on December 29th to discuss consolidating services and Town concerns with rising cost of services.

SEXUAL OFFENDER NOTIFICATION:

A <u>motion</u> was made by Councilman Ivison to publicize all Class 2 and Class 3 sex offender notifications that the Town receives from the Sheriff's Department. The motion was seconded by Councilwoman Freeman and carried with the following vote:
