### Supervisor

Corners Road, Clinton Street Road (Rte. 33), Old State Road, Cockram Road, Bank Street Road, Byron-Elba Road (Rte. 262), Tower Hill Road and Searls Road) has begun. #### REMINDERS

- -Decorations and flowers may be placed between April 1st and October 1st.
- -Please place moveable pots, containers and decorations in line with the monument. This helps with mowing the grass.
- -Glass containers are not allowed in the cemetery.
- -Trees, shrubs or flowers should <u>not</u> be planted in the cemetery without the Byron Cemetery Association's permission. They require maintenance that need to be taken into consideration. Your cooperation is greatly appreciated.

You can choose your burial plot now. John and Donna Durand, Superintendents of the cemetery, would gladly assist you in this process. Contact the Durands for available plots.

### From the Historian's Desk...

Today, Monday, May 29, 2023 our Town enjoyed another Memorial Day Parade. The weather was a nice 70-degree day. There were families lined up on both sides of the road on the parade route. The parade started at the corner of Terry Street & Route 262, and ended at the Byron Cemetery, on the corner of Swamp Rd & Route 262. The American Legion leading the parade with the Byron-Bergen Central School Band. The Bergen, Byron, & South Byron Volunteer Fire Departments were also represented with their fire apparatus vehicles. Our Town's "Uncle Sam" (Joe Riggi) dressed in his finest Red, White & Blue was riding his garden tractor giving out candy to the children along the way. The American Legion held it annual ceremony at the Byron Cemetery remembering those who we have lost this past year. The Byron Fire Department held a Chicken Bar BQ after the parade. Folks enjoyed the meal and visiting with each other. It was so nice to see all the different families out enjoying the parade and showing their pride.

Today was the first day of having the Byron Town Historical Museum open. We had several folks visit the museum and share their memories of growing up in the Town of Byron.

Byron Historical Museum is open every Sunday, starting June 4<sup>th</sup>, 2023 through September 3<sup>rd</sup>, 2023 from 2pm to 4pm. We are also open by appointment, by calling Bob & Beth Wilson at 585-409-5990.

The Byron German Lutheran Church Congregation disbanded in 1967 giving the building to the Town of Byron to be used as a museum by the Historical Society of Byron. The town painted and wired the building for electricity. In 1973, with money donated by Gillam-Grant an addition was added behind the church. In 1986, the society built a large addition to accommodate an Agricultural Display.

Our museum displays mainly items of the 1800's to early 1900's. The museum consists of four main areas. The main entrance consists of our display of women's hats, and military display. The main church consists of items used in the home, clothing, dishes, quilts, service clubs' items, and the church altar, pulpit, baptism font, and organ. The Gilliam room has yearbooks, South Byron Senior Class pictures from 1917 to 1952, old newspapers, old scrapbooks, local business journals and bathroom. The Agricultural Building contains farming equipment, old maps of Byron, and Business items.


Happy Reading--Nancy Bailey
