Water Improvement Benefit Area #1 is still moving forward. The documents necessary for the formation of the benefit area will soon be going to the Comptroller for approval, this process can take a month or it can take 9 months, especially with Covid hindering the progress of everything these days.

As most of you are aware, the Town Board held two public hearings to approve of a new solar law, a copy of which can be found on the Town's website. The Town Board feels that this new law will protect the interests of the Town and its residents moving forward with future solar projects. The Town is continuing to negotiate a PILOT and Host agreement with Excelsior, and hope to have that completed by the beginning of the year. Once again, if you ever have any questions regarding solar please call me and I will try to answer your questions or find out the answers for you.

As a reminder, our Town Board meetings are being held via Zoom to protect everyone. We highly encourage you to join these meetings on the second Wednesday of every month for information, and DO NOT rely on social media to give you the wrong information. You only have yourself to blame if you do not attend a meeting and complain about a lack of information later! The Zoom link will be on the Town website (www.byronny.com) prior to the meeting.

As you all know, Covid-19 is a very serious virus, with that being said, we are trying to limit inperson contact at the Town Hall as much as possible, not only to protect our employees, but also yourselves. We encourage you to use the drop box, mail or online payment system as much as possible. If you do need to go into the Town Hall, <u>please</u> wear a mask and practice social distancing.

You should receive your Town/County taxes by the end of December or beginning of January (unless they are escrowed with your bank), if you don't, please call me right away. Taxes are collected at the Town Hall through March 31, 2021, and can be paid by cash, check, charge (a fee applies), or money order. After March 31st you must contact the Genesee County Treasurer with regard to payment. Taxes paid after January 31st will be assessed a penalty (please see your tax bill for amounts).

As a reminder, the cost of many items, including tags, have increased at the transfer station. If you need a list of pricing, you can find an updated list on our website or ask the transfer station attendants for a listing.
