The housing market was even stronger in 2021 than in 2020. Change notices for the 2022 annual update will be sent out in March. The trend for 2021 was 11% which means the average home in Byron was selling for more than 11% above the 2021 assessed value. Home sales still continue to be well above current assessed values. This will cause residential assessments for Byron to go up in 2022 even more than the increases in 2021. The increases still may not be high enough to be certified at 100% for the 2022 assessment roll. Byron Fire Department Obtains A FEMA Grant To Upgrade It's Brush Truck

In 1973 the Byron Fire Department purchased a brand-new Chevy Custom 20 4WD Brush Truck, which provided excellent and dependable service, until this January. In March 2020, a grant application was submitted to FEMA for the purchase of a new brush truck to replace our 47-year-old unit. In October of 2020, we were notified that the grant for 95% of the total price was approved. We then started the process of obtaining a new heavy duty pickup truck, which due to the pandemic was very hard to come by. After 10 weeks of searching our vendor told us they were unable to locate a suitable heavy duty pickup truck. Members of the Department then went to work and in February 2021, we were able to order a 2021Ford F350 Cab and Chassis from West Herr Ford in Hamburg. That unit was delivered that Memorial Day weekend. The truck was then outfitted with an aluminum utility box. The truck has since been fitted with a 150-gal skid unit, pump, hoses and all related equipment needed to fight brush and field fires, supply lighting at scenes, help at motor vehicle accidents, traffic control, wires down, cellar pumps, and many other situations that may arise from time to time.

By the obtaining of a grant for 95% of the cost plus the sale of the old truck we were able to obtain a brand new four door heavy duty 4WD truck with all the current safety features, a bigger water tank and pump, better lighting, along a number of other improvements just using the grant and sale proceeds from the truck.

The new truck went in service the end of February 2022. We would like to thank Jeff Roth, West Herr Ford, for his help in obtaining the Cab and Chassis, Mike Currey, First Out Rescue LLC, for getting us the skid unit, hose, lighting, Enforcer 10, and related equipment, Jim Fodge (Churchville) for the skid unit installation work, Nate Fix (Alexander) for the radio and related electrical work and Tom Chapell (Byron) for the excellent detail work.
